This year I've been studying "The Sacred Actions of Worship" (the sacraments) for my Doctor of Worship Studies degree. My project has been to research the origins of the Eucharist in the Greco-Roman banquet tradition and create a rite for "Dinner Church" in my community, resembling the way the earliest Christians met for meal and worship.
